intense crises

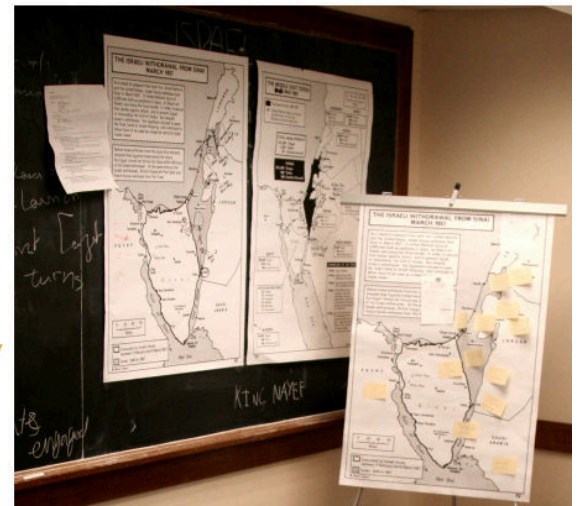
